### **Vanderwolf's pyramid limber pine**

(*Pinus flexilis* 'Vanderwolf's Pyramid')

Height: 30 ft. Spread: 15 ft.

- Twisted silvery blue-green needles
- Flexible, soft branches
- Fast-growing, compact evergreen conifer



### **Douglas fir** (*Pseudotsuga menziesii*)

Height: 80+ ft. Spread: 20 ft.

- Pacific Northwest native
- Deep green needles in spiral arrangement
- Relatively pest free



### **Deodar cedar** (*Cedrus deodara*)

Height: 60 ft. Spread: 40 ft.

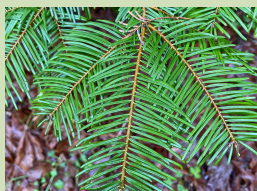
- Barrel shaped cones sit upright on stems
- Green tufted needles with graceful pendulous branches



### **Grand fir** (*Abies grandis*)

Height: 80+ ft. Spread: 20 ft.

- Pacific Northwest native
- Green needles with citrus scent when crushed
- No serious insect problems



### **Green Gable™ tupelo**

(*Nyssa sylvatica* 'NSUHH')

Height: 45 ft. Spread: 25 ft.

- Vibrant orange to red fall color
- Adaptable to a wide range of soils
- No serious insect/ disease problems



### **Turkish filbert** (*Corylus colurna*)

Height: 50 ft. Spread: 30 ft.

- Yellow fall color
- Long male catkins in early spring
- Edible nut in a frilly husk



### **Green Vase® zelkova**

(*Zelkova serrata* 'Green Vase')

Height: 50 ft. Spread: 30 ft.

- Yellow, orange, red fall color
- Patchwork of orange, brown, gray bark
- No serious insect or disease problems



### **Sterling Silver® linden**

(*Tilia tomentosa* 'Sterling')

Height: 50 ft. Spread: 35 ft.

- Yellow, orange, red fall color
- Patchwork of orange, brown, gray bark



### **Sawtooth oak** (*Quercus acutissima*)

Height: 60 ft. Spread: 50 ft.

- Yellow-russet fall color
- Narrow, bristle toothed, shiny green leaves
- Acorn with a hairy cup enjoyed by wildlife
