Crime Statistics 11 months of 2025

- 3,863 fewer crime victims across seven crime categories
- 21 fewer homicides a 36% reduction (from 58 to 37; 2019 last comparable year)
- 39 fewer non-fatal injury shootings a 28% reduction (from 137 to 98)
- 159 fewer aggravated assaults a 5% reduction (from 3,070 to 2,911)
- 244 fewer robberies a 15% reduction (from 1,580 to 1,336)
- 263 fewer theft from motor vehicles a 3% reduction (from 7,784 to 7,521)
- 1,587 fewer cars stolen a 23% reduction (from 6,876 to 5,289)
- 1,550 fewer burglaries a 19% reduction (from 8,216 to 6,666)

Crime Statistics 11 months of 2025

Homicide Case Clearance Rate

- Exceeds national average
 - The 2025 year-to-date homicide clearance rate is 83%
 - Investigations are ongoing for open cases
 - 2024 and 2023 homicide clearance rate were 57% and 49% respectively
 - The national average for homicide clearance in 2024 is 61% and 2023 is 59%












Police Neighborhood Resource Center Pilot

90-Day Impact

Neighborhood Officer Program pilot at Magnuson Park ran for 90 days (July 22 to October 30). The North Precinct assigned two officers (Unit 2U91) during second watch to operate from the Parks building within Magnuson Park.

- **CAD Events**: 4% decrease in dispatched calls compared to projected levels without intervention (statistically significant, p=0.05)
- **Property Crime**: 9% decrease compared to projected levels without intervention (statistically significant, p=0.001)
- **Service Hours:** The neighborhood officers provided 182 service hours on Priority 1-3 CAD events in the park area, representing approximately 30% of all service hours in the park area during the pilot period


Priority Area - Magnuson



Hiring Statistics

Recruitment and Retention

- A net increase of 94 officers in 2025 versus a net loss of 9 officers in 2024
- 159 hired this year compared to 70 hired last year
- As of 12/4/2025, the SPD has hired more officers in 2025 than any of the previous 15+ years
- 921 deployable officers
- 3,843 applicants met the minimum qualifications
- 65 separated from the department this year versus 79 separated last year
